

I remember talking to the Mayor of Jacksonville Beach, **Chris Hoffman** (LJ 2016), about being a woman in a position of leadership. Her perspective informed me of the challenges and rewards of her occupation, and I admired how she balanced all of her duties with grace and efficacy. It was highly encouraging to hear from her and other leaders in Jacksonville about how our great community was built and maintained." **Charlotte will be attending Harvard University** and hopes to concentrate in History of Science with a focus on

Medicine and Society.

Kendall Ford (YLJ 2021): Kendall credits his Godbrother, **George A. Pratt** (YLJ 2018) for being the driving force of the YLJ program. "One of the most impactful days was 'Everyday Creativity' Day which showed me the importance and value in including creativity and art not only in my leadership, but in all aspects of my life." **Kendall will be attending the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill** with the hopes of pursuing a degree in Environmental Science and Public Policy or Public Health. 
